



Beaver Creek & Vail / Downhill trip / March 18-23, 2010

Cost: \$969 (There is a round trip luggage surcharge by the airline of \$30 for the first piece and \$50.00 for the second piece not included in this cost).

This Trip Includes: Pre-trip party, welcome-party in Colorado, post-trip party, Northwest Airlines from Detroit Metro, 4 day lift ticket pass to Vail and Beaver Creek, five nights lodging and ground transportation to/from Denver Airport.

Beaver Creek and Vail: If you have ever skied Vail, you will love Beaver Creek which is just up the road a few miles from Vail and owned by Vail. It is a very quaint and unique resort and has 310 inches of snow a year. One really great thing about Beaver Creek is that it has many beginner (20%) and intermediate runs (43%) but also plenty of advanced runs (38%); and two big bowls: Rose and Larkspur. We will also ski Vail, which is one of the best resorts in the world, as the lift ticket will work at both resorts.

Lodging: Beaver Creek West Condominiums are in the town of Avon which is adjacent to Beaver Creek Ski Resort. We have two bedroom/two bath and three bedroom/three bath units. The condos have an upscale pool, hot tubs, and sauna. It is a short walk to the Beaver Creek Gondola and only a fifteen minute bus ride to Vail. The bus costs \$5.00 each way.

Town of Avon: Located at the base of Beaver Creek Resort adjacent to the main welcome gate, it is host to many restaurants, shops, and amenities. Avon is small enough to walk around – or use the free town shuttle that runs daily connecting the lodging, dining and shops and also goes to the lifts.
